

Highlights

- While successful in reducing the disparity gap between foreign and native-born populations, the New York City region retained its rank in 7th place based on its score.
- The gap in poverty rates experienced by foreignborn residents decreased from a 7-percentage point difference in 2012 to a 2-percentage point in 2021.
- Poverty rates for residents on both ends of the educational attainment and English proficiency spectrum decreased in 2021 from the 2012 rates. However, rates remained high in 2021, especially for limited English-proficient residents and for those on the lower end of the educational attainment ladder.
- Lower educational attainment in this region translated to higher unemployment rates.

New York City includes the counties: Bronx, Kings, New York, Richmond, and Queens.

The source of data is the American Community Survey, 2021, one-year data. The data includes all foreign-born individuals who are 16-64 years of age.

¹ Scorecard is calculated based on the performance of the region against seven economic indicators; income, poverty, unemployment, working poor, full-time work, homeownership, and rent burden. The region's performance is calculated based on the differences in the seven economic outcomes between foreign-born and native-born New Yorkers. We calculate a standardized score for seven outcomes using the mean and standard deviation of each outcome across the state. Then, we average these scores for seven scores to compose one general index score indicating the overall disparity between foreign-born and native-born New Yorkers in each region. Higher index scores can be interpreted as positive and lower scores can be interpreted as negative.

 $^{^{2}}$ Rank represents the performance of the region when compared to the other nine regions of New York State. 1 = best performer; 10 = worst performer.
